

Step-by-step guide for students

****Plugin:**** ZSK AI course labelling (`local\_zsk\_ai\_generated`)

****Goal:**** Understand what the labels mean – and honestly declare whether you used AI in submissions.

What you see on screen

Notice box and badge on course material

If your teacher marked ****course content**** as AI-generated, you see:

- on the ****course page**** a ****notice box**** (blue/green) stating that the course or activity contains AI content
- a small badge ****“AI generated”**** next to marked activities in the course overview

****Hover**** (mouse over the badge): tooltip with extra information (e.g. which tool, which scope – if the teacher provided it). Badge text and tooltip appear in the ****language you selected in Moodle**** (language menu).

This applies to ****material provided by the teacher****, not your own submissions.

Badge on others' submissions (Forum, Glossary, Wiki, Database)

If a ****classmate**** declared AI use on a post, glossary entry, wiki page, or database entry, ****you as an enrolled student**** also see the badge ****“AI generated”**** next to that content.

Hover shows the author's declaration (tool, scope, description).

****Exceptions:****

- ****Guests**** (not enrolled) do not see these submission badges.
- ****Assignments:**** Your AI declaration is mainly visible to ****you**** and the ****teacher**** – not other students.
- ****Workshop:**** You see your own AI badge; for ****others’**** workshop submissions only if Moodle shows them to you ****and**** you have the required permissions (in practice mainly the teacher). Details below.

Part A: Declare AI use in your own submission

Your teacher may require or allow you to document whether you used AI. The form section is called ****AI assistance****.

Step by step (Forum, Glossary, Wiki, Database, Workshop)

1. ****Create**** or ****edit**** post / entry / page
2. Scroll to section ****AI assistance****
3. ****AI used:**** choose ****Yes**** or ****No****

****If you choose “Yes”:****

4. ****Scope of use**** – check at least one option (e.g. brainstorming, outline, draft text)
5. ****Tool**** – enter name (e.g. ChatGPT, Copilot)
6. ****Description**** – briefly explain how you used AI
7. ****Save**** or ****submit**** post / entry

****If the teacher set “Required”:**** With “Yes”, tool, scope, and description are mandatory. With “No”, extra fields are hidden.

****If you do not see “AI assistance”:**** The teacher disabled the feature for this activity – you do not need to declare anything.

Assignment (`mod\_assign`) – slightly different path

1. Open assignment → ****Edit submission****
2. Next to online text / file submission, the ****AI transparency declaration**** area appears (if the teacher enabled it)
3. Fill in fields as above
4. ****Save changes**** / ****Save submission****

Part B: What happens after you submit

- Your post may show a badge ****“AI generated”**** to others (depending on activity) ****if**** you chose ****AI used: Yes****.
- With ****No****, ****no**** badge appears.
- Your declarations can be reviewed by the teacher and in the system audit log (compliance).

Part C: Workshop – special case

In ****Workshop**** you can add AI declarations to your ****own**** submission (as in Part A).

****Others’ workshop submissions**** (e.g. during peer assessment):

- The plugin does ****not**** treat Workshop like Forum or Wiki.
- ****Other students**** generally ****do not**** see an AI badge on a classmate’s work – even if they declared AI use.
- The ****teacher**** sees badges in grading/overview.

This is intentional: Workshop often uses ****anonymous**** peer review; a visible AI badge on others' work would be a separate institutional decision (not yet implemented).

Quick overview

| Situation | What to do? |

|-----|-----|

| Teacher material with badge | Read notice; critically review content |

| Own submission with AI | Fill in ****AI assistance**** honestly |

| Others' forum/wiki post with badge | Author disclosed AI use – hover for details |

| No form visible | Not required for this activity |

| Assignment | Usually only you and teacher see your AI declaration |

Tips

- When transparency is required, ****explain more**** rather than omit details.
- Choose ****“No”**** only if you really did not use AI (including for ideas, wording, or proofreading).
- After saving: reload the page and check whether the badge appears (only with ****Yes****).
